Dear Church Family,

"Forgiving fits faulty folk. And we are all faulty. The rest of us belong to that catholic club where nobody dares throw the first stone. For us to forgive others, then, has a certain congruity about it, a kind of fittingness, for the mixed bag of vice and virtue that we all are.

"All this explains why Jesus was so tough on sinners who refused to forgive other sinners. He saw the laughable incongruity of people who need to be forgiven a lot, turning their backs on people who need a little forgiving from them....

"Jesus grabs the hardest trick in the bag – forgiving – and says we have to perform it or we are out in the cold, way out, in the boondocks of the unforgiven. But why is Jesus so tough on us? He is tough because the incongruity of sinners refusing to forgive sinners boggles God's mind. He cannot cope with it; there is no honest way to put up with it." (Lewis B. 
