Dear Church Family,

M. Scott Peck tells the story of the Sufi master strolling through the streets with his students. When they came to the city square, a vicious battle was being fought between government troops and rebel forces. Horrified by the bloodshed, the students implored, "Quick Master, which side should we help?" "Both," the master replied. The students were confused. "Both?" they demanded. "Why should we help both?" The master replied, "We need to help the authorities learn to listen to the people, and we need to help the rebels learn not to always reject authority." (M. Scott Peck, The Different Drum, 71)

We live in a polarized society. The reality, most often, is that truth is found somewhere in the middle. Extremists in either direction most often fall into dangerous ditches. Whatever your position, whatever the issue, look to the middle to see another point of view. Absolute truth will always be absolute — uncompromised.
